Udi Bar-David is widely considered one of the most versatile cellists in the world today. Equally at home as a classical cellist and an innovative improviser of music of all genres, Udi has enjoyed performing on International stages with both classical and ethnic musicians from all over the world. A graduate of both the Juilliard School and Curtis Institute of Music, Udi is currently a member of The Philadelphia Orchestra. Inspired by visits to Arab, Jewish and Buddhist villages, in 2003, Udi became the co-founder, president, and artistic director of Intercultural Journeys. Spreading the messages of hope, understanding and co-existence, Udi continues to work tirelessly to perform and create opportunities for open dialogues, bringing people together from different cultural backgrounds at universities, public venues, and peace loving communities. His unique genre of cross-cultural music has been heard all over the world. In the last few years, Udi has traveled as far as Spain, Italy, Palestine, Israel, Cuba and across the United States with the International group of Intercultural Journeys' artists, including Mandy Patinkin, Jie Bing Chen, Nawang Khechog, Hanna Khoury, Wu Man, Diane Monroe, R. Carlos Nakai, Kareem Roustom, and Simon Shaheen. Together, they have made numerous appearances on International radio and TV, and collaborates regularly with WHYY and WRTI in Philadelphia.

Keiko Sato, who joined the faculty of The Curtis Institute of Music in 1987, received her Bachelor of Music degree from Curtis where she studied with Mieczyslaw Horszowski and Gary Graffman. She also holds a Master of Music degree from The Yale School of Music where her teachers were Seymour Lipkin and Claude Frank. Ms. Sato is the First Prize Winner of the Manogue International Competition, the Golden West Young Artist Competition, and the Young Chopin Competition in New York, and has performed as soloist with several orchestras including the Charleston Symphony and The Symphony Orchestra of The Curtis Institute of Music. In addition to playing recitals throughout the United States, Canada and Japan, where she was born, Keiko is an active chamber musician who also performs with members of The Philadelphia Orchestra. She serves on the faculty of the Curtis Institute of Music and Swarthmore College.
